WHEREAS, the Town includes within its budget a line item for Youth Services ("Youth Services Funding") to support summer recreation opportunities for youth in the community ("Summer Recreation Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Village of Ravena ("Village") maintains a Pool Complex (the "Pool") to provide Village residents an opportunity to cool off during the summer months under the supervision of certified lifeguards; and

WHEREAS, the Village seeks to support the Town's Summer Recreation Program; and the Town seeks to have the Pool made available to Town residents who reside outside the Village under the same terms and conditions as it is available to Village Residents; and

WHEREAS, Article 5-G, Section 199-o of the General Municipal Law specifically authorizes municipal corporations to enter into intermunicipal cooperative agreements; and

WHEREAS, the parties believe that cooperating in connection with the Summer Recreation Program and Pool is in the public interest of the taxpayers of the respective municipalities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Town agrees to enter into an Intermunicipal Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") with the Village, in substantially the form annexed hereto. This Agreement is subject to review and changes, if any, by counsel for the parties.
- 2. The Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to take such actions and sign such papers as necessary to facilitate the signing and implementation of this Agreement.

Seconded by Council member ______, offered for discussion and duly put to a vote, the results of which appear above.

<u>Discussion:</u> Town Attorney Reilly clarified the monetary value that will change hands. He believes it was \$6,000 coming from the Village. Council Member Schmitt stated he was not comfortable approving this resolution as it stands as he thought the amount was \$9,000 from the Village. He would like further clarification.

- 5. The Town Board authorizes the Town Supervisor to take such actions and sign such papers as necessary to facilitate the purchase of the Vehicle, including the signing and transmission of the Letter of Intent.
